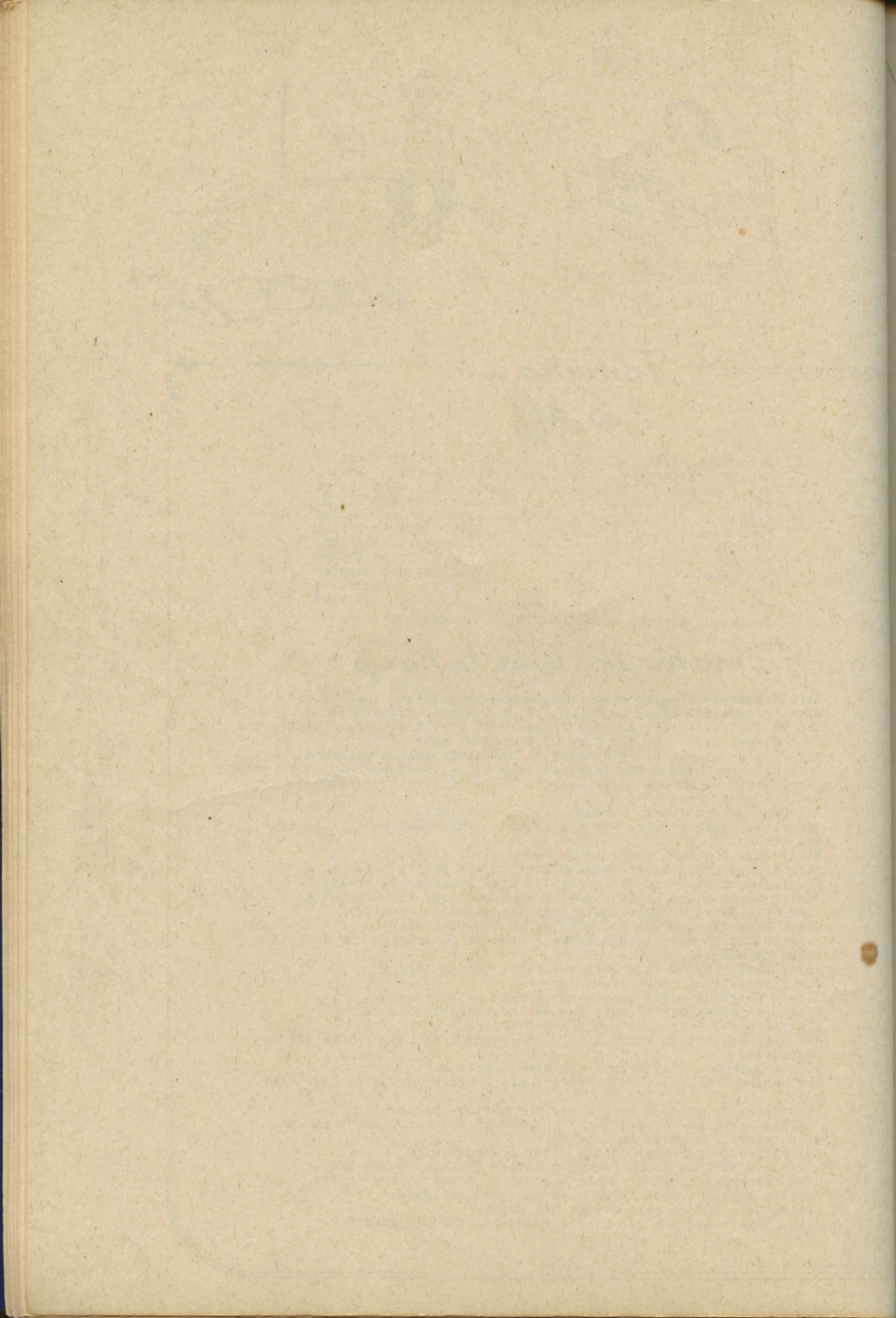
The next event on our calendar was the production of our year book, "The Tomahawk", a reminder of the many swell times we had with our fellow classmates.
