Runaway Thief Dies In Shooting

A 26-year-old holdup suspect was shot and killed Tuesday night after he ran his car into a snowbank during a high-speed police chase which followed a robbery of a Pontiac Township market.

Emmett E. Ransom of 366½ Ferry, Pontiac, was dead on arrival at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, Pontiac.

The two-mile chase at speeds up to 120 miles an hour started when Oakland County Deputy Sheriff Roland Pless saw Ransom run out of the Holdsworth Market, 2653 Auburn, Pontiac Township, with a gun in his hand.

Pless fired six shots at Ransom as the suspect drove away in his souped-up car. Pless gave chase in his unmarked police car and radioed for help. Deputy Gerald Reeves joined the chase.

Ransom lost control of his car as he attempted to turn from Auburn onto Shirley and skidded into a snowbank.

Reeves ordered Ransom to surrender but Ransom backed his car out of the snowbank and knocked the deputy to his knees.

Reeves fired five shots at Ransom's car, which stopped about 100 feet away.

Police said they recovered from Ransom an automatic pistol, \$69 and a wallet belonging to the owner of the market, William Holdsworth, 46.
