Driver Sees Train Wreck Stalled Car

Harold Burch, R. 4, Mason, watched as a train demolished his stalled automobile Friday morning.

Michigan State college police said Burch was en route home on Harrison rd. at 5:15 a. m. Friday when he lost control of his car and ran into a post which supports the guard rail at the Chesapeake and Ohio grade crossing.

The car bounced off the post, stalled in the middle of the railroad tracks and refused to start again, so Burch headed for a nearby house to make a telephone call for a wrecker, police

The man who lived in the house helped Burch build a small fire on the tracks to warn trains but the fire apparently was too small, police said. Min-utes later, a C & O train roared into the stalled car.

The end of the story was sad for Mr. Burch, who not only had a demolished automobile on his hands but was arrested and taken to East Lansing justice court for not having a valid operator's license, and for failure to comply with the financial responsibility required of him by a Michigan court in order to drive.

He waived examination before Justice Henry Schram and his case was bound over to circuit court Monday. He was released on \$200 bond.

Burch, was born 25 May 1930, Mason, Ingham County, Michigan. He attended but did not graduate from Okemos High School. Harold was a member of Class of 1948.

In 1947 he joined the US Army and served during the Korean Conflict. After the war he married and settled back in Ingham County. Later he married a 2nd time, Maxine Elaine "Mickey" (McDaniel) Smith.

Harold died 8 March 1993, Lansing, Ingham County, interment unknown. Mickey, born 22 February 1922, died 30 April 2006.
