Robert Markwart of Okemos, who was seriously injured Aug. 6, at the Lansing Steel Fabricating company on Dawn ave., East Lansing was "doing well" at the Ingham County Chest hospital Thursday, relatives said. Mr. Markwart suffered several fractured ribs and a concussion when the battery racks he was loading broke causing 1,600 pounds of steel to fall on him.

Bob recovered from his accident. He went on to have an employment career with Lansing General Hospital and with Burcham Hill Retirement Center.

Bob with family, 7 September 1992, was enjoying an evening boating trip on Morrison Lake in Ionia County when a grandson fell into the lake from the boat. Bob, in trying to rescue the small child, had a heart attack, drowned and died.

Ionia - Grandfather's body found: A 61-year-old Eaton Rapids man who jumped into Morrison Lake on Sunday to save his grandson was pulled from the water by a dive team Monday, said the Ionia County Sheriff's Department.

The body of Robert Markwart was discovered at 11 a.m. in about 25 feet of water in the Boston Township lake. Sheriff Terrence Jungel said.

The victim was boating with his family when his 2-year-old grandson fell out of the boat at about 9 p.m. Sunday, Jungel said. Markwart jumped into the lake to save his grandson, but began clutching his chest seconds after jumping in. Jungel said the victim may have had a heart attack.

The victim's son, Garry Markwart, then jumped in to save the two, but was only able to save the child.

A dive team searched nearly two hours Sunday for the body, but darkness made the search difficult, Jungel said. The search continued at about 9 a.m. Monday until the body was discovered a short time later, Jungel said.

"We suspect the drowning may have been the result of cardiac arrest," Jungel said.

The victim was transported to Ionia County Memorial Hospital where he was pronounced dead.
