
**Floyd George Cornell**, son of William Homer (1903-1982) and Florence J. (Hathaway) (1909-1990) Cornell, was born 4 September 1930, Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan. Floyd attended Okemos High School with the class of 1949 and was listed as a junior in the 1948 Tomahawk Yearbook.

Floyd married Marian Edith Austin 11 March 1950, Okemos. The couple lived in the Lansing area for several years



while Floyd was employed at the Milling Forge, a Lansing foundry. Floyd later moved his family, which would expand to 5 children, to the Clare County, Michigan area where they lived for a number of years.

Floyd and Marian both died 1 October 2002, Clare County. No newspaper obituary has been located. They were interred together Pleasant Plains Cemetery, Harrison, Clare County.
