





**Gordon Ray Delamarter** Age 82, passed away peacefully on January 30, 2013 after a long battle with pulmonary fibrosis. He was preceded in death by his parents, Charles and Eugenia Delamarter, and his sister Dorothy Knopf. Gordon was born on February 27, 1930 in Okemos, Michigan.

During the Korean War, he served as a Quartermaster on board both the USS Essex and USS Curtis, where he received the naval honor of Meritorious Mast for his exceptional service. After the Navy, he was involved in banking and insurance sales. He was an active member of the Albion Rotary Club. He was an avid reader and history buff, with a great love for researching genealogies. He was proud of the fact that six of his ancestors arrived on the Mayflower.

Gordon was survived by his wife, Roberta (First-Delamarter); mother of his children, Mary (Corn-Delamarter); children Ronald (Renae) Delamarter, Charles Delamarter, and Julie (Todd) Simpson; six grandchildren; and sister Barbara Jean (Robert) Ward.
