
Benjamin R. "Benny" or "Ben" Guile, son of Earl Clinton (1899-1973)

From his squad of nine new men, Shippey has picked Chet Koski to start at center and Sam Alagna at the other guard, with either George Taylor or Murl Tanner at the other forward.

Also due to see action are Don Slivenski, Larry Semrau and Clarence Hagerman at guards, Bob Kennedy and Bob Cross at forwards.

Okemos has only one letter-winner back, Dick Benne at forward. Due to round out the team are Bill Dyer, Howard Antcliff, Ben Guile and Lloyd Lowery at forwards, Berman Prether and Mackie Black at center, and Curt Travis, Glen Bennett, Bob Murphy and Dee McDonald at guard.

Ben, drafted into the US Army in 1953, was honorably discharged from service in 1955. Married with 4 children, Ben died at age 40, 6 November 1972, Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan. He was interred East Lawn Memory Gardens, Okemos, Ingham County.
