

Mrs. Phylllis McCrumb was her sister's matron of honor in a light blue gown of lace over taffeta. She carried pink carnations.

Harry Burch was best man and ushers were Curtis Travis, brother of the bride and Max McKenzie, brother-in-law of the bridegroom.

Howard, born 9 December 1932, was a 1951 alumni of Okemos High School and a US Army veteran. Howard was employed as a commercial interior and exterior painter by a firm out of Flint, Michigan. On 7 July 1970 he was critically injured in a 60-foot fall while sandblasting the exterior of downtown Lansing building. Howard never fully recovered from his extensive injuries and died 3 August 1987, Ingham County.

Antcliff Family Finds 'Good' Happens, Too

Mrs. Howard Antcliff says she feels people often hear only of unpleasant incidences and are not aware of good things which happen.

Like what happened to her last week, for example.

Her husband has been hospitalized since a construction accident July 7, and on Nov. 3 friends of the Antcliff family held an open house at the Hanford Thorn residence, 2540 E. Jolly, to raise funds to help defray living expenses for the family.

ONLY INCOME

Since the accident, the only income for Mrs. Antcliff and her five children, who range in age from 3 to 13 years, has been a \$104-a-week workmen's compensation check.

The response to the open

house was more than expected, according to Mrs. Antcliff and Mrs. E v e l y n Baker, who helped organize the event.

More than \$300 was donated by people who attended the open house or sent checks in the mail and Mrs. Antcliff said she did not even know some of those who gave.

Mr. Antcliff, 37, was employed by the Austin Paint Co. and was injured last July when he fell 60 feet from a swing stage while sandblasting the exterior of the State Employes Credit Union Building at 501 S. Capitol.

STILL BEDRIDDEN

Two weeks ago, after spending over three months in Sparrow Hospital, he was transferred, still bedridden, to the Ingham County Extended Care Facility in Meridian Township, where he is undergoing therapy. "I don't really know how to go about it, but I just want to thank all the people who sent checks or came to the open house," Mrs. Antcliff said.

Mrs. Baker said Mrs. Antcliff also received notes of encouragement with some of the checks which did a lot to buoy her spirit.

"It was wonderful," Mrs. Antcliff s a i d. "You always hear about the bad things and often don't realize there are still many wonderful people in the world."
