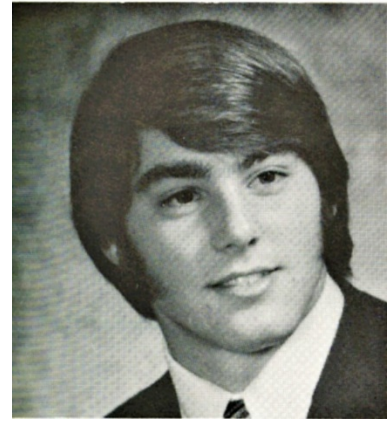

No bidders step forward for abandoned apartments

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development postponed the sale of **Vista Sierra Apartments**, 2002 E. Fort Lowell Road, after no buyers showed up at an auction Wednesday to bid on the vacant complex.

The sale was postponed to 11 a.m. March 18, said attorney G.

Lee Crosby Jr., the designated foreclosure commissioner for HUD. It will take place outside the east entrance of the Pima County Courthouse at 110 W. Congress St.

Neighbors of the abandoned apartment complex have been frustrated by the tagging and graffiti there, and by the squatters who move in at night.

The bid kit released by HUD before Wednesday's auction required any purchaser to demolish the complex within nine months and redevelop the property within three years.

Lee is survived by his spouse, Sue; two children, Natalie and Gary Lee, III; his brother, Greg; his Mother, Millie; and many other friends. Lee is predeceased by his Father, Gary Lee Crosby.

Lee exemplified honesty, trustworthiness and loyalty; in law practice, in business and in family. He will be deeply missed and always remembered.
