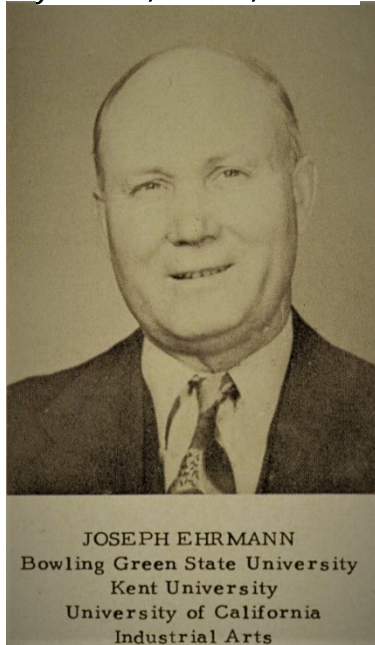


Joseph Edward Ehrmann (also spelled Ehrman), son of William Zeschke (1876- 1946) and Magdalene "Lena" (Ehrmann) (1878-1946), was born 14 March 1900, Ohio.

William and Lena were wed 28 February 1900 in Defiance, Defiance County, Ohio. The marriage was a short one and Joseph was the only child. Lena, who never remarried, eventually resumed her Ehrmann maiden name as did Joseph.

Joseph, according to the 1910 and 1920 US Federal Census, lived in his German born grandparent's home. He graduated from Bowling Green State Normal School (Bowling Green State College and now Bowling Green University), Bowling Green, Wood County, Ohio, with an industrial arts teaching degree about 1924. He was also credited with either attending or attaining further degrees at Kent State and University of California.

Joseph seemed never to stay long in any school system. He taught industrial arts in numerous Ohio school systems; Youngstown, Holland, Celina, Coldwater, Paulding.

OLIVER OPYDKE IS MADE DIRECTOR OF LAVOIE CORP.


