Rose S. Grettenberger, daughter of Johann Christian "John" (1843-1923) and Maria Catherina Louisa (Hoag) (1857-1918) Grettenberger, was born 13 August 1882 Meridian Township, Ingham County, Michigan. Rose probably graduated as the Class of 1998 from what was then the school house in Okemos and then attended a normal school or high school which gave her a total of 4 years high school education. The Okemos school house only went to a 10th grade level during that era.

Rose came from a large family. One brother, Louis (1895-1964), went thru the 10th grade in Okemos, finished his high school years at Mason, Ingham County, and went on to become a well-known Michigan attorney living in the Grand Rapids area.

Rose was a teacher in the Okemos school for a number of years during the early 1900's. Newspaper references confirm 1911 through 1913.

His job took him to numerous locals in Michigan and, for several years, in Jefferson Point, Iowa. William Danford Slough followed his father's footsteps and also was a railroad telegrapher operator. The World War I Draft Registration documents William Danford employed by the Santa Fe Railroad in Arkansas City, Cowley County, Kansas as a telegrapher. William was described as tall with blue eyes and brown hair.

Editor's note: William's middle name was Danford, his middle initial D. Numerous documents and newspaper articles identify William as "William S. Slough."


KIN OF OKEMOS RESIDENTS DIES
