


After college he returned to St. Francis De Sales to teach and coach, later moving to Stockbridge and then became, for many years, a part of the teaching staff at Okemos High School. He married <u>Carol (Brabon)</u> <u>Grabemeyer</u>, also a teacher at Okemos, in the 1990's

Jon was an outstanding and successful coach at Okemos. He is remembered fondly as "Coach

Woz." Even after retirement Jon continued to coach at Okemos. He and Carol wintered in Florida where Jon succumbed 23 February 2017, Polk County.

Wozniak coached Charles Arrington (11) during his freshman and sophomore years. Arrington, along with his throwing teammates, found out the next morning about his passing.

"Everybody on the team knew he was not doing well, but being with him at practice, you couldn't tell," Arrington said.

"His enthusiasm and the way he was showed no weakness, no signs of giving in."

Brian Harrod (CTE) coached alongside Wozniak for 15 years. He said that everyone will miss his fishing stories and his love for the Ohio State Buckeyes.

"I considered him to be a great friend and mentor," Harrod said.

"What I admired most about him was his ability to see potential in everyone."

Arrington not only mentioned what a good coach he was, but also what a great man he was.

"A man of that caliber is rare nowadays and he will be missed," Arrington said.

Okemos coach is track award finalist

Okemos track assistant coach Jon Wozniak is a finalist for a national coach of the year award from the National High School Athletic Coaches Association.

Wozniak is a longtime shot put and discus coach for the Chieftains. In 2003, Astin Steward and Okezie Aguwa both won Division 1 state titles in the discus. Steward's Division 1 state meet record from that day 154 feet, 9 inches, still stands.

Coaches are nominated by their state coaches associations, with eight national finalists then chosen for each sport. Winners will be named during the NHSACA annual meeting June 21-23.








Wozniak graduated from Toledo St. Francis High School in Ohio where he played football, baseball, basketball and track. He went from high school to the University of Toledo to play football on a full ride scholarship. His football career came to an unfortunate end when he suffered a severe head injury in his last preseason game after signing a contract with the Dallas Cowboys out of college.

Wozniak then moved back to teach and coach at his alma mater, Toledo St. Francis, before moving to Michigan. In Michigan he coached multiple sports at Stockbridge High School before he started at Okemos.

Wozniak was survived by both his wife, Carol, and his son, Andrew. They will plan a memorial service to honor him that will take place sometime this spring.
