

Roy David Schulz, son of William Ernest (1896-1963) and Myrtle Searles (1903 - ?) Schulz, was born 12 May 1925, Ingham County, Michigan.

Myrtle birthed a stillborn daughter 19 December 1918. The infant was interred in Glendale Cemetery, Okemos. Myrtle and William were married 30 December 1918, Okemos. Their second child, Leon Herbert, was born 26 January 1921, Okemos and a third child, Harry Eugene, was born 7 February 1924, Okemos. Harry succumbed to "pneumococcal meningitis" at 23 months, on 11 January 1926, and was interred Glendale Cemetery. Another son, Roy David, was born 12 May 1925, Okemos, and Russel Evert came into this world on 18 June 1929, Okemos.

The family may have been in turmoil. A Lansing State Journal article dated Saturday 6 February 1932 headlined; "Says Wife's Love Lost; Asks Decree." "Charging that his wife, Myrtle Schulz, had said that she no longer loved him and that she had been too friendly with another man, William Schulz filed a bill of complaint for divorce Saturday. The couple married in 1918, has three children." William raised the three boys. Myrtle remarried in 1936, divorced in 1941 and then faded into obscurity.

Roy, who played varsity basketball, graduated from Okemos High School in

1943. He joined the US Marine Corps 14 June 1943 and was honorably discharged 12 January 1946.

Roy married Gwendolyn Rose "Gwen" Chapin 14 June 1952, Mason County, Michigan. The couple celebrated 48 years and 3 children together before Roy died 8 August 2000, Grand
