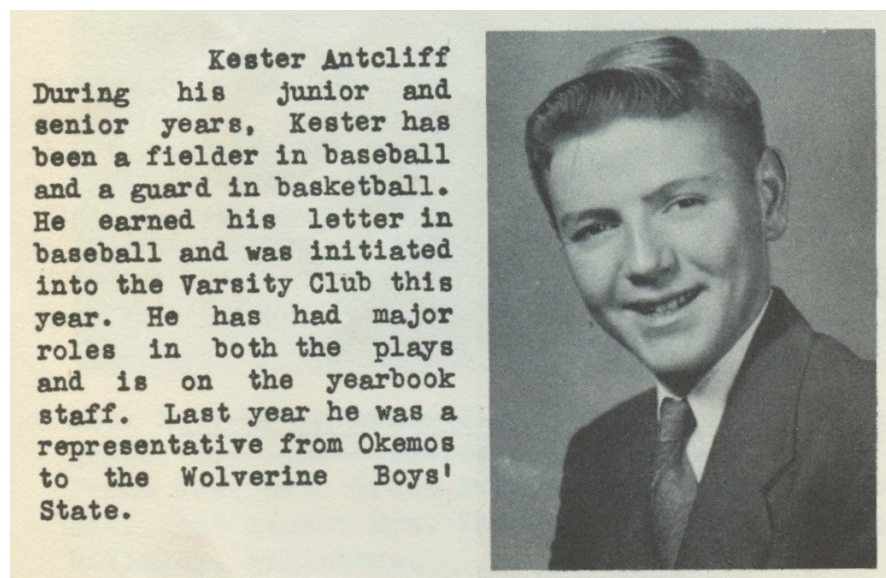


Kester J. Antcliff, aka Kester Junior Antcliff or Chet Antcliff, was the son of Warren F. (1908-1965) and Lilly Elizabeth (Newman) (1911-1931) Antcliff. Chet's parents were married 27 July 1928, Belding, Ionia County. Their son and only child, Kester J. or Chet, was born 10 November 1929,



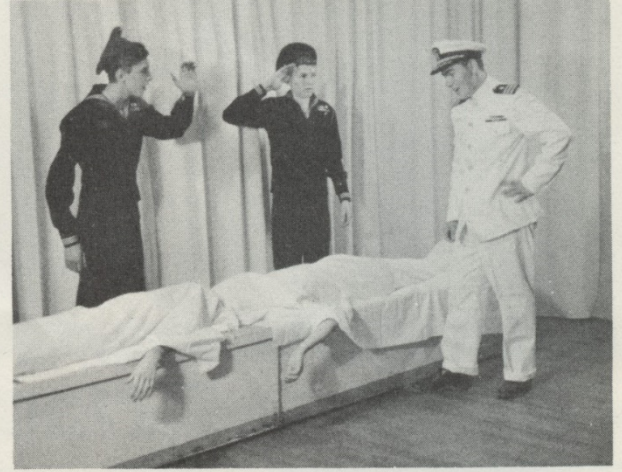
Belding. Lillie succumbed to typhoid fever and "acute dilatation of heart" 21 November 1931. Her death certificate stated she died in the "City Pest House" at Belding. The Pest or Pestilence House was a quarantine hospital or dwelling unfortunately so named.

Warren Antcliff's brother, Kester C. Antcliff (1910-1989), married Lilly's sister, Mamie (1913-2005) in June 1933. Chet went to live and was raised by Kester C. and Mamie. Although official documents such as social security application, marriage license etc. continued to detail Warren and Lilly as blood relation, Chet referred to Kester C. and Mamie as his father and mother. He was listed as a son in their obituary write ups.



Chet Antcliff graduated from Okemos High School in 1947 and was active in plays and athletics.

INFRACTIONS COST \$93.60

Kester J. Antcliff, 26, of 541 Forest st. East Lansing, changed his plea to guilty Friday afternoon in East Lansing justice court on charges of driving with no license and driving at excessive speed.

He paid \$93.60 for infractions.

Antcliff, who has been ticketed seven times on the no license charge, told police he had never applied for one in seven years of driving.

He was arrested Monday following an accident in which his car ran into the rear of a truck stopped for a red light at the corner of Grand River ave. and Haslett st.

Judge William H. Wise fined him \$64.30 on the no license charge and \$29.30 on the speeding count. He told Antcliff his attitude in driving since 1948 without an operator's license was "deplorable."

Antcliff told the judge he had applied for his first license Tuesday.

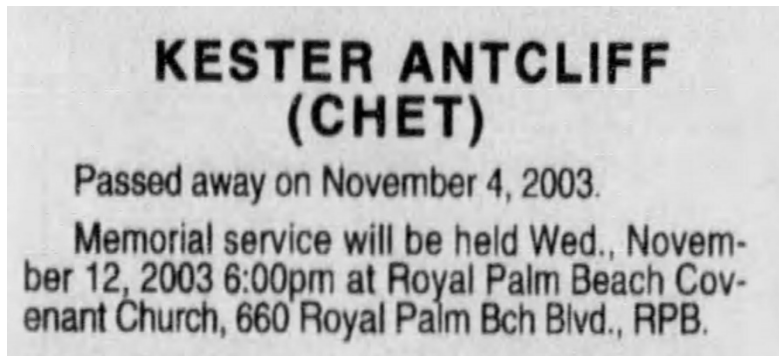
