In dual track meets we defeated Sexton High School 46-34, and Haslett 63-46, while losing to Everett 60-49. The bright spot of the Everett meet for Okemos was a 10:0 flat, 100 yd. dash by Dick Ewing for a new school record.

The Ingham County League meet saw Okemos coming out on top for the second straight year with 50 points.

At the Albion Invitational meet Okemos took first place with 38 points. Dick Ewing set a meet record with a 10.2 100 yd. dash. He also won the 220 yd. dash. Our 880 yd. relay team won as a new school record was established. Their time was 1:36.5 and the runners were Bob Davidson, Lyle Davis, Gerry Roosa and Dick Ewing. Other boys who placed in the meet were Bob Davidson, 3rd in the 100 and 220 yd. dashes; Mike Sweeney, 3rd in the mile; Gerry Roosa, 3rd in the 440 and in the sprint medley team of Merrill Edwards, Chuck Webb, Lyle Davis and Gerry Rozan.

In the Regional Meet at Mt. Pleasant, Okemos took 3rd with 23 points as Dick Ewing took 2nd place in both the 100 and 220 yd. dashes. Gerry Roosa 2nd in the 440 yd. dash and the 880 relay team of Bob Davidson, Lyle Davis, Gerry Roosa and Dick Ewing won.

At the State Finals, Okemos took 3rd with 17 points as Dick Ewing won the 100 yd. dash and finished 2nd in the 220 and our 880 relay team set a new school record of 1:36.7 as they won the state relay race. 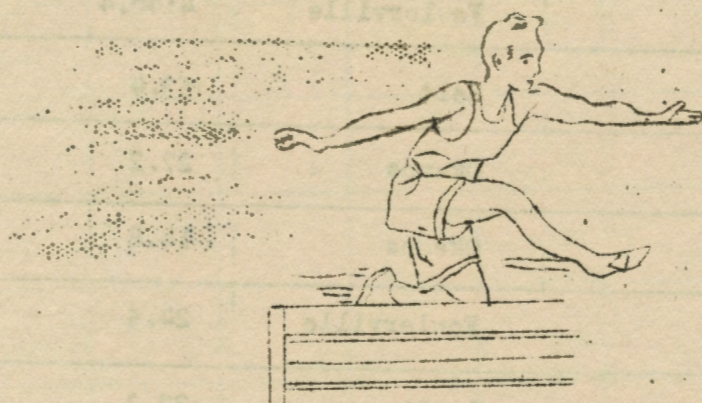

# Flint Northern Easily Cops 'A' Title; St. Louis Paces Class C Schools

## Everett's George Price Sets New Pole Vault Record; Miller Wins Shotput

The 1953 collection of high school track stars battered six records and tied another—the oldest in the books—as favored Flint Northern won the Class A title and St. Louis walked off with the 'C' honors on Michigan State's track Saturday.

Almost perfect track weather prevailed as Flint Northern's Leon Burton and Pontiac's Alanzo Harris co-starred in the 'A' meet, and St. Louis' freshman ace, John Palmer, stole the show in the 'C' competition.

Northern topped the larger schools with 37 points. Pontiac, runner-up last year, repeated in the role with 24 points. Kalamazoo was third and Saginaw, the defending champion, was fourth. Lansing Eastern was fifth.

Berrien Springs was second to St. Louis, 30 to 23½. Okemos was third with 17 counters, and Everett next with 15½.

While the Saginaw Valley athletes dominated the meet, Lansing came in for its share of glory when Everett's George (Whitey) Price set one of the six records, and Eastern's Jim Miller won the Class A shotput title.

Price erased the 'C' vault mark of 11 feet 7½ inches set in 1942 when he leaped 11 feet nine inches. Dick Content, also from Everett, also took a shot at the new record when he and Price were the only contestants to clear 11-3. Content missed three times at 11-9, and Price missed twice before completing the record.

Miller, undefeated for the season, won the shot with a toss of 51 feet 1½ inches.

Burton paced Flint Northern and set a new record in the 180-yard low hurdles when he won in 19.1 seconds—just two-tenths of a second off the national prep mark. The old mark was 20.4 seconds set in 1950. Burton placed second in the 100-yard dash, fifth in the broad jump and anchored Northern's winning half-mile relay team but had to give up high-scoring honors to Harris. The little Pontiac Negro, defending dash champion, won the 220 and the broad jump, was third in the hundred and helped Pontiac's relay team come in fourth for 17½ points.

Harris tied the 220 record when he toured the distance in 21.7 seconds. George Hester of Detroit Northern had set the record in 1923.

Gerald Zitny of Dearborn Fordson broke another 'A' record when he won the mile in 4:28.8. The old mark was 4:30.8, set in 1940. Northern's medley relay team started things off by wiping out

# Track Title To Everett

## Vikings Gain 'C' Regional Honors at Mt. Pleasant; Okemos Third

MT. PLEASANT, May 7—Lansing Everett won the Class C regional track championship here Saturday afternoon, scoring 44½ points to finish ahead of St. Louis and Okemos, which had 33 and 30½ points respectively. Mt. Pleasant won the Class B title with 65 points, with East Lansing tying for fourth with Caro. Lansing Resurrection was eighth. Boys Vocational School was the only other Lansing area school to score, tying with Farwell for tenth place in Class C. Merrill won Class D honors with 52 1/5 points.

Coach Chuck Sweeney's Vikings thus added the regional crown to other laurels gathered this season. Everett won the Central Michigan Indoor Invitational, the Hastings Invitational, the Albion Relays, and finished second in the River Rouge Relays, 1/6 of a point behind the winner.

The Vikings qualified six men and the sprint relay team for the state finals next Saturday. The Everett relay team of Glen Gray, Gary Munson, George Price and Jim Diederichs set a new meet won both hurdle races and also record of 1:37 flat. Other Vikings to qualify were Art Smith, who qualified in the high jump, Diederichs in both sprints, Dick Content and Price in the pole vault, Jack Summers in the board jump, and Dick Bettison in the low hurdles.

Okemos qualified four men and both relay teams for the finals, and in Dick Ewing presented one of the stars of the meet. Ewing knocked a fifth of a second off the 100-yard dash record in his preliminary heat, and then lowered it again in the finals. His new record is 10.15 seconds. He also won the 220 yard dash.

Other Okemos qualifiers were Dick Hartsuff in the half mile, Dee McDonald in the low hurdles, and Jerry Roosa in the 440. McDonald and Roosa both took first places in their sections of the events. Both the quarter mile and half mile were run in two sections, with the first two places qualifying.

Lee Staser, East Lansing half-miler, Frank Goble, Resurrection miler, and John White, quarter-miler from Boys Vocational school were the only other individuals to qualify for the finals. Staser won his section of the half-mile. The Trojan medley relay team also qualified.

ALBION, May 9—Lansing and area schools dominated the Albion Invitational track meet here Saturday.

Eastern high walked off with the Class A honors, Howell topped the Class B standings and Okemos won the Class C title. Norman-Dickson of Brethren easily won the Class D crown.

The Quakers, who just missed winning the Five-A league title Friday night, tallied 50 points to Kalamazoo's 36. Ann Arbor, the Five-A league champion, was third with 35 points. Battle Creek had 26 and Sexton ten to finish eighth.

Sexton's relay team of Jim Zick, Dick Frazier, Fred Schworer and Doug Huggett won the medley honors for all of its points. Eastern was second. The Quakers 880 team also finished second, this time behind Ann Arbor. Sexton set a new meet record with a winning time of 2:36.3.

Other point winners for Eastern were Frank Mann, fifth in the 440; Bruce Kyburz, third in the lows; Roger Shepler, fourth in the broad jump and third in the pole vault; Frank Green, second in the 880; Ed Cary, fourth in the 880; and Carl Drews, fifth in the vault.

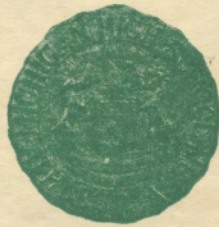

6. **DRAWINGS** — Heat leaders will be placed according to the records made in the Regional Meets. Drawing for lanes in the dashes and hurdles will be made previous to the start of the meet. Positions in the distance races will be drawn at the start of the race. **THERE WILL BE NO COACHES' MEETINGS.**
7. **WEIGHT MEN** — Have your shot checked for weight and size at the shot put ring.
8. **CHART OF THE FIELD** — Location of all starts, finishes, pits, rings are shown on Page 12 of this program.
9. **TRAINING**—Trainers will be available on the field during the meet.
10. **ORDER OF COMPETITION** — In all running events Class A will compete first, followed by Class C. However, all classes must be ready to start each event, so that positions can be drawn while another class is competing.
11. **Coaches and Trainers must stay in the stands during the meet. Contestants must keep out of the infield area unless actually competing in the field events.**
12. **TIME SCHEDULE** — Events will be run according to the schedule on Page 2 of this program. There will be no calls made, **SO BE READY. Be warmed up and ready to go on scheduled time.** Dash and hurdle men can warm up on the West Straightaway.
13. **FIELD EVENTS**—See Page 12 for location of pits, etc.
  - Pole Vault — All Classes in Pit 2.
  - High Jump — All Classes in Pit. 1.
  - Broad Jump — All Classes in Pit 3.
  - Shot Put — All Classes in Ring 1.
14. **TRACK EVENTS** — The 100 and 220 Yard Dashes, High and Low Hurdles will be run on the straightaway; the 440 and 880 will be run out of the chute; and the One Mile Run and both Relays will be run around the track. In the 880 Relay the start will be staggered with the first runners in lanes and exchanging in the same lane with their number two teammate, thereafter the positions of teammates will be reversed from inside to outside at each exchange mark. In the Medley Relay the start will be staggered around first turn and the positions of teammates will be reversed from inside to outside at each exchange mark.
15. **PRIZES** — Trophies for the winner and runner-up in the meet and winner of each relay in each class. Medals for the point winners in each event in each class. In case of ties, the State Association will attempt to provide duplicate awards. Winners will please sign up for their awards immediately following each event. The custodians of prizes will be located in the tent at the north turn of the track.

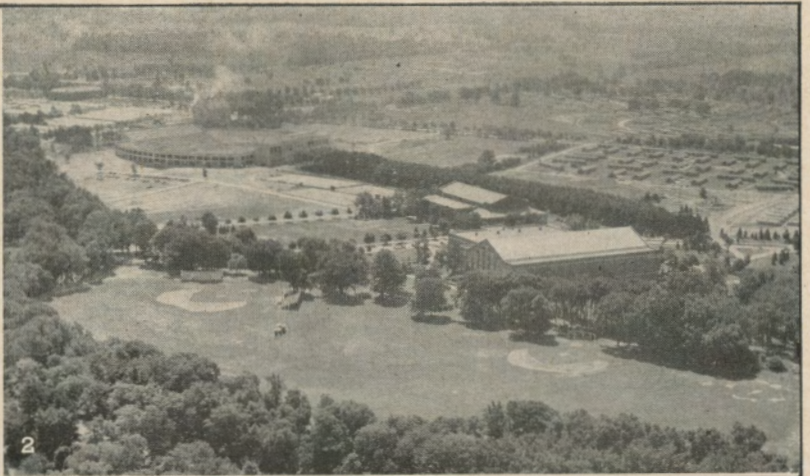


### Michigan State College:

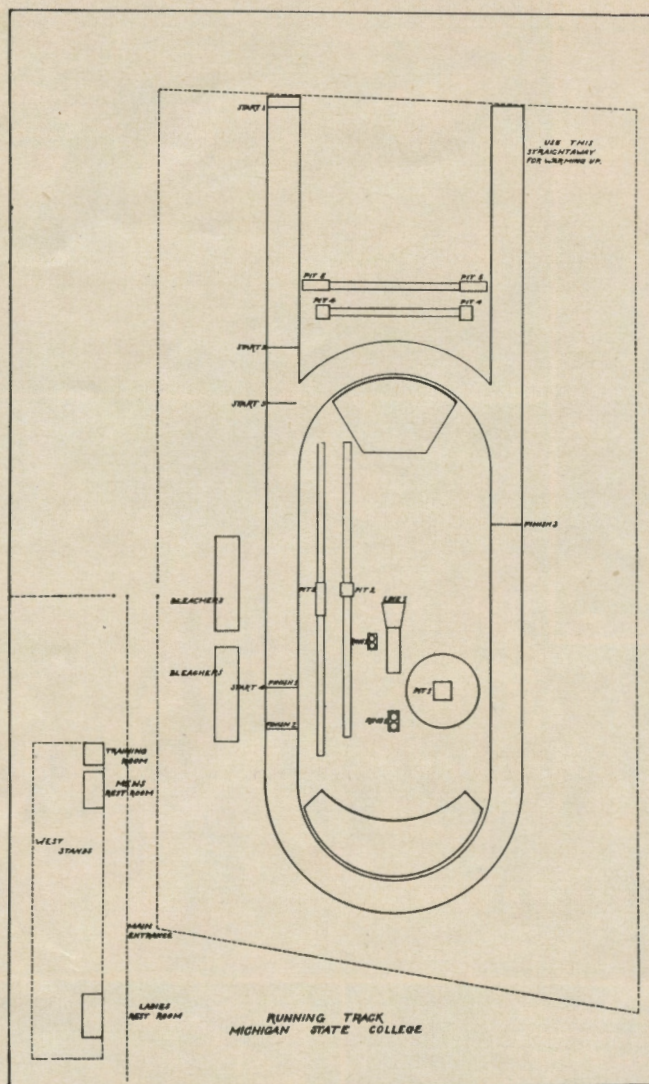


## Michigan State Athletic Plant
