graduation in 1992 from Stanford University Law School. In 1994 he was admitted to the California State Bar and from March 1994 until September 1999 he was employed by the Santa Clara County, California Public Defender's Office.

Bramlett W. Hamilton of Okemos recently won a college-sponsored four-year achievement scholarship funded by the National Achievement Scholarship Program for Outstanding Negro Students in Evanston, III. Hamilton is an Okemos High School student and plans to attend Michigan State University.
